






Improve the national BES evidence base by coordinating the co-creation of National Ecosystem Assessments (NEAs)


Strengthen the BES policyscience-practice network around the IPBES assessment themes through **Trialogues**

Gender analysis **mandatory** for all newly commissioned IKI projects




Gender-responsive project planning/implementation as a minimum standard for IKI projects

Insight I – Donor priority (i): IKI Gender Strategy (Cont'd)

Five action areas for implementation:



**Governance, scope and accountability:** commitment at all levels with a clear division of tasks



Criteria for implementing organizations and adaptation of processes: anchoring of gender aspects in all stages of the project cycles



Gender competence (internal and external): gender competence-building and awareness-raising



**Knowledge management and communication:** active data collection, exchange and learning



**Resources and budget:** adequate resource allocation for action areas 1-4





# Insight 2 – BES-Net I final project evaluation: recommendations

#### Post-assessment stage



Maintain a **triangular network** to drive the implementation of the assessment findings.



Leverage **established platforms** to engage in public awareness of assessments and findings.



Involve national ecosystem assessment and Trialogue champions for knowledge sharing.





#### Timeline of IPBES assessment under the 2030 work programme













Thematic assessment on the sustainable use of wild species (2022)


