## Concept Note and Agenda

### Background

Since its inception in 2017 and building on over 20 years of ecosystem assessment experience, UNEP-WCMC's Ecosystem Assessment Initiative (formerly [National Ecosystem Assessment Initiative](#)) in partnership with UNDP and UNESCO through the Biodiversity and Ecosystem Network ([BES-Net](#)) has supported countries around the world to conduct or scope national ecosystem assessments.

Seven national ecosystem assessments have been completed and government-approved, each accompanied by a Summary for Policy Makers in [Azerbaijan](#), [Bosnia and Herzegovina](#), [Cameroon](#), [Colombia](#), [Ethiopia](#), [Grenada](#), and [Viet Nam](#)—providing critical evidence to inform biodiversity planning and decision-making. Eight additional national ecosystem assessments will be finalized and launched by the end of Quarter 2 of 2026 in Botswana, the Dominican Republic, Malawi and Thailand.

Following the [approval and validation](#) of a national ecosystem assessment, the process enters a phase focused on the [dissemination and use of assessment findings](#). The findings may be applied across sectors and governance levels and inform the development and implementation of priorities and policies.

For example, fifteen strategic messages from the Colombia National Ecosystem Assessment directly informed the [National Development Plan \(2022–2026\)](#),

strengthening the integration of biodiversity considerations into national development priorities. In Viet Nam, national ecosystem assessment recommendations are being implemented through [a pilot Payment for Wetland Ecosystem Services \(PWES\) initiative at the Tram Chim National Park](#).

At the international level, national ecosystem assessment findings could help strengthen national participation and implementation of multilateral agreements, including the Convention on Biological Diversity, and the Intergovernmental Science-Policy Platform on Biodiversity and Ecosystem Services ([IPBES](#)).

## Objectives

The webinar aims to:

- Share country experiences in the dissemination and use of national ecosystem assessment findings in decision and policymaking.
- Discuss how approaches to the use and dissemination of assessment findings can be further improved to achieve maximum impact among decision-makers and other stakeholders.

This webinar is organized as part of the Sub-Global Assessment Network ([SGAN](#)) and is relevant to national ecosystem assessment teams, practitioners and experts in the fields of biodiversity and ecosystem services, as well as policymakers, researchers, civil society representatives, and media professionals interested in these topics.
